The origins of paper...

About 2,000 years ago, inventors in China took communication to the next level, crafting cloth sheets to record their drawings and writings. And paper, as we know it today, was born! Paper was first made in Lei-Yang, China by Ts'ai Lun, a Chinese court official. In all likelihood, Ts'ai mixed mulberry bark, hemp and rags with water, mashed it into pulp, pressed out the liquid and hung the thin mat to dry in the sun.

During the 8th century, about 300 years after Ts'ai's discovery, the secret traveled to the region that is now the Middle East. Yet, it took another 500 years for papermaking to enter Europe. One of the first paper mills was built in Spain, and soon, paper was being made at mills all across Europe.



"Ah, vacation....!", said


These days these children are such a bother. For while they are playing

How did Mount Everest get its name?

The first recorded efforts to reach Everest's summit were made by British mountaineers in 1921. As Nepal did not allow foreigners to enter the country at the time, the British made several attempts on the north ridge route from the Tibetan side. In 1849, Andrew Waugh, the British Surveyor General of India decided that Peak XV (Everest was referred to by this numeral) should be named after British surveyor Sir George Everest, his predecessor as Surveyor General of India. In 1865, the Royal Geographical Society officially adopted Mount Everest as the name for the highest mountain in the world. Tenzing Norgay and Edmund Hillary made the first documented ascent of Everest in 1953.

He graduated from Stanford University with a degree in electrical engineering in 1996. He worked at Accenture which was then owned by Arthur Anderson and a year later joined a startup called Net Gravity, where he became a key figure in the company's operations and greatly expanded its prominence. In the coming years the startup was acquired by DoubleClick. From California he moved to New York, to the company's headquarters and gradually became more involved in central business affairs within the company. He went on to become the vice president of business operations. On April 13, 2007 Google agreed to acquire DoubleClick. While at Google, many members belonging to known platforms like Twitter and Facebook attempted to hire Neal. He finally joined YouTube in 2015 as Chief Product Officer. On 16th February, 2023 he succeeded Susan Wojcicki and became YouTube's fourth CEO.
